



- Ch. 17-18 displayed the defeat of the harlot known as Babylon.
- In ch. 19, the victory of the Lame and His people is proclaimed.
- While they are jubilant and praising God, the enemies of God's people are judged.



- Read 19:1-5
- Alleluia Praise the Lord (Hallelujah).
- <u>V1</u> salvation, glory, honor, power belong to God.
- V 2 the events of the previous chapter resulted in praise. The destroyer is destroyed!
- V 3 the punishment in judgment is eternal.
- V 4 24 elders (God's people) and 4 living creatures (God's character) voice their agreement with all that was done.
- V 5 a single voice from heaven in response. An angel? The Lamb?



- Read 19:6-10 marriage supper of the Lamb
- As the marriage supper of the Lamb is about to be declared, a thunderous voice of praise is heard (multitudes, many waters – all of God's people).
- God is praised for his **OMNIPOTENCE**, "all-ruling"
- His wife has <u>MADE HERSELF</u> ready. We want to be ready to meet the Lord (parable of the 10 virgins).
  - V 8 she is arrayed in fine linen, the righteous acts off the saints.
  - What we do is important. We need to live holy lives in obedience to God's will.
- V 9 the **<u>BLESSING</u>** of being called to the marriage supper.
  - The only way to be there is if we are the bride!
  - We are called by the gospel, whether we answer the call or not is up to us.


- V 10 John was overwhelmed by the things which he saw.
  - He fell before the angel who was with him (v 9, "he") to worship him.
  - He was rebuked. No one, neither man nor angel are worthy of worship.
  - Worship God and Him alone.

White horse (REV 6:2) Faithful & True (REV 3:14) Judges in righteousness (JN 7:24) Eyes like a flame (REV 1:14; 2:18) Many crowns (REV 6:2) A special name (REV 2:17) Robe dipped in blood (ISA 63:2-3) Called the Word of God (JN 1:1) A sharp sword (REV 1:16) Rod of iron (REV 2:27; 12:5; PS 2:9; ISA 11:4) Winepress of God's wrath (ISA 63:3; REV 14:19-20) King of kings, Lord of lords (I TIM 6:15)

- Read 19:11-16 king of kings & lord of lords...
- The description in this text draws from images associated with Jesus in Revelation and elsewhere in Scripture...
- It is about the Messiah, JESUS.



- 19:17-21 the supper of the Great God
- There are 2 feasts in this text. The marriage supper of the Lamb (we are the bride if we are there).
- Or, the supper of God's wrath (all who are not ready for the supper of the Lamb).
- NOTE the guests are actually **ON THE MENU**!!!
- The image of this supper is borrowed from Ezekiel 39:17-20 (judgment against Gog & Magog; Gog was the king of Magog, which was linked with the posterity of Japheth, Gen 10:2; 1 Cor 1:5).
- V 19 this is the battle of Armageddon (16:16) being retold.
  - V 20 the beast is captured, along with the false prophet (the other beast)
  - V 20 they are cast into the lake of fire.
  - V 21 all who side with the beast are destroyed.



- 20:1-10 the 1000 years.
- In 9:1, the 5<sup>th</sup> angel who sounded a trumpet was given the key to the bottomless pit. Whether this is the same angel or not, we don't know.
- Regardless, an angel comes with a key to the pit and chains the devil, casting him into the pit for 1000 years.
- There are 6 references to the 1000 years in the text...
  - It is not a literal period of time. Numbers in the book are symbolic.
  - It is a perfect or complete long period.
- The **DEVIL IS IMPRISONED** throughout the entire time (v 2).
- His power is **<u>RESTRAINED</u>** (v 3).
  - NOTE restrained doesn't mean he is unable to do harm.
  - He can no longer deceive the nations & accuse the brethren as he once did.
  - Consider a vicious dog that has been chained. So long as you

keep your distance, it cannot hurt you.

- The righteous **<u>REIGN</u>** with the Lord (v 4).
  - When does Jesus' reign begin? Some future date? Look at Mark 9:1.
    - In Acts 2:30-33 Peter speaks of Christ sitting on His throne (fulfilling Psalm 110:1-2).
    - Colossians 1:13 says God has "...delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of His love..." (present tense)
  - The thrones are for the righteous.
    - Eph 2 made to sit together in heavenly places.
    - John identifies the characteristics of those who partake in His kingdom:
      - Beheaded for their witness to Jesus
      - Beheaded for their witness to the word
      - Had not worshiped the beast or his image (us)
      - Had not received the mark on the forehead or hand (us)
    - Some of those pictures are deceased, yet in Christ, they live and reign with Him. Others are alive and upon the earth (cf. 5:10, "...made us kings and priests to our God; and we shall reign on the earth.")
- The rest of the dead (v 5) did not live again until the 1000 years were finished.

- These are the enemies of the Lord, they are in spiritual death.
- When they die, they go to torments in hades.
- These unrighteous dead did not receive the **<u>FIRST</u> <u>RESURRECTION</u>**.
- The first resurrection describes spiritual life, obedience to the gospel, being conquered by the one on the white horse).
- Those who experience the first resurrection are not overcome by the second death (v 6), which is hell. They have eternal life!
- They are **PRIESTS OF GOD AND OF CHRIST** (v 6).
  - 1 Peter 2:9 (cf. Rev 20:6) refers to Christians as "...a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, His own special people..." (present tense)
  - Revelation 5:10, "...has made us kings and priests to our God, and we shall reign on the earth."
- The devil is **LOOSED BRIEFLY** (v 7).
  - V 3, "...after these things he must be released for a little while."
  - V 8, he goes out to deceive the nations, here described as Gog & Magog, to gather them for battle.
    - This is the Armageddon scene again.
    - Who are Gog & Magog? Ezekiel helps...
    - Eze 38:16-17 there is no one nation that the prophets said would come against Israel.
      - Gog & Magog are used as a catch-all for

the enemies of God's people.

- For Israel (northern tribes) it would be Assyria;
- For Judah (southern tribes) it would be Babylon;
- For Judea (1<sup>st</sup> century) it would be Rome;
- Eze 38:18-23 even though they were used to judge His own people, they would be destroyed by the Lord for their wickedness.
- Satan calls for Gog and Magog to join him in battle against the Lord (Rev 20:8). The devil and all the enemies of God's people will be destroyed (v 9-10).
- How long will the devil's release be?
  - Long enough to be judged.
  - He is pictured gathering the nations for battle (he doesn't give up); but we've seen this picture before (Armageddon).
  - He was defeated before he started.
- V 10 the devil, the beast and the false prophet are cast into the lake of fire.
  - we've seen the same characters previously, just identified differently:
  - Ch. 13 Dragon, beast from the sea, beast from the earth;
  - Ch. 17 Devil, scarlet beast, great harlot Babylon
